#### Trick Number One

Look for words within words and use sentences or phrases to remember them.

There is a <u>dent</u> in indepen<u>dent</u>. indepen <u>dent</u>
I am in parl<u>iam</u>ent. parl <u>iam</u> ent
A sep<u>arat</u>e rat sep <u>a rat</u> e
(But remember desp<u>erat</u>e has <u>e</u> before r not a.)

#### Trick Number Two

You can use sentences to remember difficult parts of a word.

One <u>collar</u> and two <u>sleeves</u> are ne<u>cess</u>ary on a shirt. (But remember that o<u>ccas</u>ion is the other way around.)

#### Trick Number Three

Remember there are some 'Double Trouble Words'.

Accommodation – two double letters
Committee – three double letters

#### Trick Number Four

Remember that some words are spelt differently if they are a noun or a verb.

Practice = noun Violin practice makes you a better musician.

Practise = verb I like to practise my violin playing every day.

#### Trick Number Five

Look at this word. RAVEN

Split it up and it will help you to remember whether to use 'affect' or 'effect'.

R av en

Affect = verb Effect = noun

For example:-

Spelling tests have a terrible effect on me!

They affect me terribly!
